

Assistant or Associate Professor Ophthalmology

The Department of Clinical Studies, Ontario Veterinary College at the University of Guelph, invites applications for a tenure track faculty position in Veterinary Ophthalmology at the rank of Assistant or Associate Professor.

Applicants must have a DVM or equivalent veterinary professional degree, be licensed or eligible for licensure to practice in the Province of Ontario, and be a Diplomate of the American College of Veterinary Ophthalmology or have completed an ACVO-approved residency-training program. Candidates who are Diplomates of the European College of Veterinary Ophthalmology are also eligible to apply. Preference will be given to individuals with an advanced degree. Candidates must have demonstrated research capability. Research of a collaborative or independent nature consistent with the research goals of the Department and College is expected. The ideal candidate should have a strong background in clinical ophthalmology and outstanding teaching, interpersonal and communication skills. The ability to work with others in a collegial team atmosphere is essential.

The successful candidate will work with other faculty to provide clinical and didactic instruction in ophthalmology. The successful candidate will have fifty to sixty percent effort dedicated to clinical teaching and service for patients in the OVC Health Sciences Centre, including remunerated participation in out-of-hours emergency duty support of your patients. Provision of clinical teaching to fourth-year DVM students, interns, and residents/DVSc students of other disciplines, along with training and mentoring of ophthalmology residents, is expected. The remaining effort is to be spent on professional development and scholarly activity, including research and supervision of graduate students. Research of an independent or collaborative nature is expected.

The Ophthalmology Service is well equipped with dedicated suites, an operating microscope, an electroretinogram, a diode laser, and a phacoemulsification unit. Other specialty services include emergency medicine and critical care, small and large animal internal medicine, small and large animal surgery, cardiology, dermatology, neurology, oncology, and anesthesiology. The faculty and staff of the Department of Clinical Studies and the OVC-HSC are committed to delivering the very best of patient care, veterinary education, and research.

The department highly values Indigeneity, Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion and applications from equity-deserving groups are strongly encouraged.

In addition to salary, the University offers 22 days of paid vacation per year and eligible employees a generous retirement, benefits, and leave package. Once tenured, faculty may apply for paid research/study leave (i.e., sabbatical) for every six years of service. Faculty are permitted to earn additional income through external remunerative activities on approval from the Dean.

Application Process

Assessment of applications will begin on **May 21, 2024** and will continue until the position is filled. Interested applicants should submit the following materials (preferably as a single PDF file): (1) a cover letter; (2) a curriculum vitae; (3) a teaching statement; (4) a research statement; (5) an equity, diversity, and inclusion statement, (6) names and contact information of three referees.

The teaching/mentorship statement (1 page max) should briefly describe your teaching philosophy, experience, and examples of specific teaching strategies you have found effective. The research statement (1 page max) should briefly present a vision of your goals and interests. The EDI statement (1 page max) should describe how you ensure your teaching, clinical, and research activities provide equitable and inclusive opportunities for students from diverse backgrounds.
